


Frederick Hull 1879 – 1916

11.10.1916 died Norfolk, Witton Camp, North Walsham

Plot 80, URC, Tiptree

Age: 36/37

The camp was jittery about a German invasion. That evening Frederick went to the pub with his mates, but as a good Congregationalist returned after only one drink. He was challenged by his Sergeant but didn't respond in the correct manner and was shot.

Autumn 1915 Moved to Forfarshire. 08.11.1915 Became the No. 12 Battalion. Mar 1916 Resumed identity and moved to Norwich. April 1917 Moved to Taverham and then Norwich. Oct 1917 Disbanded.</p>
